
DIY Time!

Collar Lare Materials:

- Wooden Dowel
- Oven Mitt (horse's head)
- Large Googley Eyes
- Yarn (mane)
- Thick Ribbon (bridle)
- One piece of cardboard/foam board the length you want your mane to be (about a foot or so)
- 2 Small Paper Cups
- Hot Glue

Directions:

- 1. Hot glue googley eyes on both sides of oven mitt (face mitt with thumb portion facing down-the mitten at end will be the horse's mouth & loop of mitt at top -this will be an ear)
- 2. Hot glue both cups together at the top rim. Once dry insert into oven mitt (helps keep the head shape)
- 3. For the mane: measure length of mitt onto your wooden dowel & add a few inches & mark spot. Wrap your dowel with the yarn to the marked spot then secure with hot glue. Wrap yarn around cardboard about 50 times then remove yarn from cardboard & put around dowel on wrapped portion. Secure with hot glue then cut the loops at the bottom to create strands of "mane"
- 4. Hot glue the wrapped mane portion of dowel to the inside seams of oven mitt (both sides)
- 5. Hot glue ribbon around "nose" just above the thumb and finger portion of mitt. Then hot glue ribbon up the side of face and create reins. Enjoy your stick horse!
