


Let's Learn About Horses!



What Color Is That Horse??

Horses come in lots of different colors! But do you know what those colors are called? Read the descriptions to learn about the colors. Then, choose one and color the horses!

Bay: the body color is a shade of red or brown and the mane & tail are black. Sometimes a bay horse has black on their lower legs also.

Black: the body is a true black color without any other colors mixed in. The mane & tail are also black.

Buckskin: body is yellow or gold colored, the mane & tail are black, and there is black on the lower legs.


Chestnut: the body is a red color, and the mane & tail are usually a shade of red also.


Dun: yellow or gold body color, black mane & tail, a black stripe down the middle of their back (called a dorsal stripe), and sometimes they have black stripes across their legs.

Gray: a mixture of white with any other colored hairs. These horses are often born a solid color and then get lighter and lighter as they get older.

Palomino: the body is a golden yellow. The mane & tail are white.

There are many more colors of horses, but these are just a few of the more common ones.
