Melanie Wilson Kelley



You have heard of tireless volunteers, dedicated individuals, and altruistic citizens. This year's show dedication honoree embodies all of these attributes and more. It is with great pleasure that the 2006 Kentucky State 4-H Horse Show be dedicated to Melanie

Wilson Kelley. Melanie is a native of Ballard County. She then moved to Carlisle County with her husband Steve Kelley. Melanie has been a 4H Leader for 14 years. She has been a Carson Park 4H Horse Club Leader or assistant leader since her children were old enough to be in 4H. Her children, Katie Kelley Kramer and Kristopher Kelley have grown up through the 4H Horse Program and succeeded at horse show, judging, speeches, demonstrations, photography and hippology. As an indication of their efforts and success, both Katie and Kristopher have received the Klepkeke Scholarship. Melanie has served on various local, area, district and state horse committees and was Chairperson of the former Purchase Area 4H Horse Committee, chairperson of the Western Kentucky 4H Horse Camp Committee which included Purchase, Pennyriple and Green River Areas and has served as a delegate to the State 4H Horse Advisory Committee for 9 years.

Melanie is a stickler for detail and everything she does, she does well. She expects the same from the youth and other adults she works with. She is always willing to give 110% to any effort she undertakes. Melanie has traveled many miles for her children, her 4-Hers and the Kentucky 4-H Horse Program in general.

She has attended H.E.L.P. Sessions, the AYHC National meeting in Lexington in 1999 and several other 4-H Horse Leader Training opportunities. Dr. Robert Coleman says he truly values her skill in the wording of guidelines, rules and any other matter which requires attention to details.

Her son, Kristopher, calls Melanie, "Super Mel". He recalls her doing the work of ten people at the State 4-H Horse Show and loving every minute of it. You could call on her for assistance day or night and she would do anything in her power to help her own kids or her 4-Hers. Her daughter, Katie, tells of her dedication to the 4-H Horse Program this way, "As I was talking to my mother the other day, one of the first things she said was 'Horse camp is this weekend, are you coming down?' Four hours away from Murray, with work the next day, no I couldn't make it to horse camp. She was mostly joking when she asked that question, but then, there was a serious note in her voice. *She* would be at horse camp, just as she had for the past fourteen years. Although I was unable to attend horse camp that weekend, she was there – to encourage, to facilitate, and to serve; giving to the program that has impacted our family so much over the years."

The day after Katie's horse camp invitation from her mother, she received a call sharing the news that the State 4-H Horse Show would be dedicated to *her mother*! Katie says, "There could not be a more deserving person for this honor than the dedicated volunteer that is our beloved mother. Learning from 4-H herself as a child, she wasted no time getting my brother and I involved when we were old enough. Before we even had a horse, mom was directing us to 4-H. Then it was a whirlwind of horse club, State Events, photo projects, horse judging, horse camp, and perhaps the highlight – the State 4-H Show. She tirelessly supported us and the program no matter how much whining she was enduring, or how close she was to a heat stroke, or how fast we were walking away while she was trying to pin a number on our jackets.

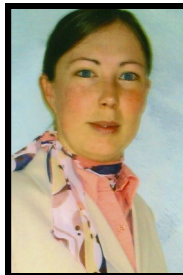
She would stay up until 2am polishing boots only to wake us at 4am to practice before showmanship. Everyone knows you have to ride first, then bathe, then be ready for showmanship at 8am.” Melanie’s husband, Steve, says, “I know you want to help make the world a better place and you believe 4-H is making a difference in children’s lives. I am so very proud of you.” Melanie’s mother, Martha, and her mother-in-law, Mary, both are very proud of Melanie’s dedication and believe the 4-H program and its participants are enriched because of her efforts.

In addition to her horse related 4H efforts, Melanie has served as President of the Carlisle County 4H Council; a member of the Carlisle County Youth Protection Standards Committee; and President of the Purchase Area 4H Council. She has chaperoned for 4-H Veterinary Science Club and served as a 4H Camp Counselor.

Melanie is an Attorney and served as Carlisle County Attorney for 3 years. She currently serves as a Master Commissioner. She served on the School Based Decision Making Council in Carlisle County for 5 years, served on the Regional Champions Against Drugs Council and has been Basketball Booster Club President for her son’s school. She is a member of Morn’s Valley Christian Church.

Melanie has a true commitment to 4-H and to the 4-H Horse Program in particular. She believes in serving her community to the best of her ability and we are lucky she chose the 4-H Program with which to share her time and talents. For those of you who know this amazing woman, you know she does this all with kind words and a smile. If you were in 4-H with Katie and Kristopher, you might know her as Katie and Kristopher’s mom. But, if you’re involved in the program now, you simply know that there is still a woman from western Kentucky who has outlasted her children in this worthwhile program. She volunteers if ever there is a need and is determined and efficient in accomplishing every task, often without even being asked. Melanie Wilson Kelley is truly in the business of making the best better. It is with pleasure that we dedicate the 2006 State 4-H Horse Show to Melanie Wilson Kelley.

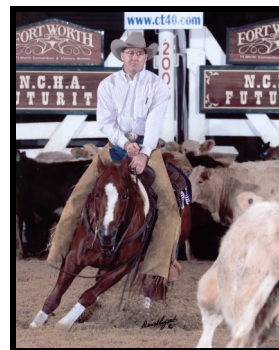


Dr. Dennis Sigler

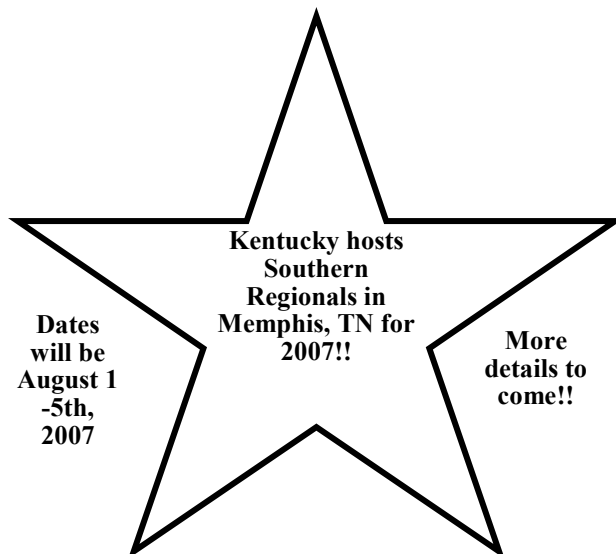

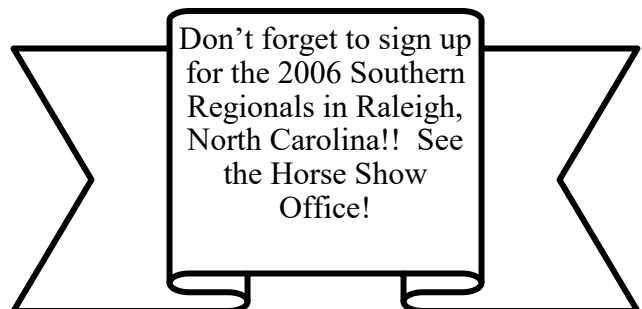

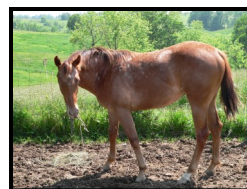

Special Thanks

Department of Agriculture: We extend a special thanks to Richie Farmer, the Kentucky Commissioner of Agriculture, for providing funding for the 4-H Horse Program in the amount of \$50,000. This funding is used to increase premiums at the State 4-H Horse Show, provide funding for 4-H Horse Club members representing Kentucky at national events and is distributed to District 4-H Horse Councils throughout the state to support District activities. In addition, the Department of Agriculture provides four \$500 savings bonds drawn from District 4-H Horse Show participants. This year's savings bond recipients will be announced Wednesday, July 12th at 7 pm during the Show Dedication.

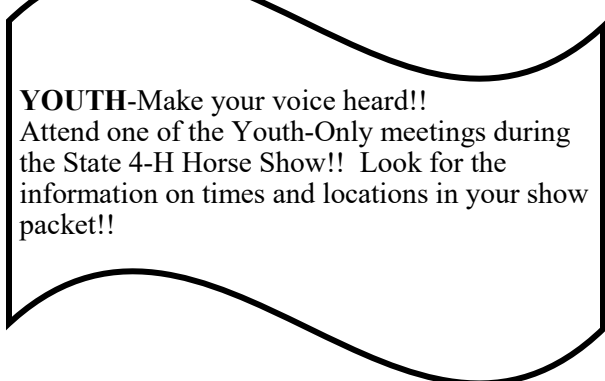
