Tom Curry

Tom Curry first became involved with Kentucky 4-H as a parent in 1989 when his oldest daughter joined 4-H. He soon became involved as a volunteer and served as a club leader for the Saddle Up 4-H Club in Campbell County from 1991-1994. During this time he helped organize and conduct the county 4-H Horse Camp, club horse shows and the Alexandria Fair 4-H Horse Show. Next, he

became involved in the Northern Kentucky Area 4-H Horse Council and served as Vice President and President during 1994-1998. During this time, he worked with the Area 4-H Horse Camp, Area 4-H Horse Show and the Area 4-H Horse Banquet.

Shortly thereafter, Tom was elected and served as a delegate to the State 4-H Horse Council. He served as President, Vice President and Treasurer of the State 4-H Horse Council from 1997-2007. Through his involvement on the state level, he was instrumental in getting the safety helmet rule established for all 4-H Horse events and for working with the Kentucky Department of Agriculture in securing funds for the State 4-H Horse Program. As a result of his efforts, the Kentucky Department of Agriculture now provides \$50,000 annually to support Kentucky 4-H Equine Programs! Tom has volunteered 1 week each year to the State 4-H Horse Show and served as announcer, measured ponies, emceed the dedication ceremony and sang the national anthem many times during the State 4-H Horse Show.

Tom became involved in the District #3 4-H Horse Management Team in 2003 and has worked with the Rules of Governance, District 4-H Horse Shows, budget and audit committee and other activities. He also serves on the State 4-H Horse Scholarship Program. He worked to establish this in 1999 when he and his family donated a Quarter Horse Yearling and raised \$10,000 through the first State 4-H Horse Raffle. Since this, he has worked with additional raffles, t-shirt sales, horse auctions and has raised about \$35,000 for the fund which has awarded \$5,000 in scholarships to date. He continues to serve as Treasurer of the State 4-H Horse Council and a volunteer for the scholarship program.

Tom volunteers as a judge for numerous 4-H events on the county, area and state level, and has also judged the Communications events at the Eastern National 4-H Horse Roundup. In 2005 and 2007, he and his family worked with the Cooperative Extension Service and Conservation District to host an Equine Field Day at their farm.

Tom and his wife, Helen, have been married for 31 years and have 3 daughters-Emily, Carianne and Megan. Their farm is located in Eastern Campbell County where they raise horses and hay.

Wendy Gruskiewicz comes to Kentucky from Jefferson, Ohio where she is the owner and stud manager of Mithra Training Stable, an equine stallion depot and breeding facility.



She has an associate degree in Equine Science from the Ohio State University. Her judging credentials include being a USEF "R" Arabian judge since 1991, Arabian Horse Association judge since 1991, and 4-H approved judge in Ohio and Pennsylvania. She has adjudicated over 200 horse shows since 1976 in all divisions including Dressage, Hunters and 4-H. Mostly notably, she has judged the 2004 US Arabian National Championships, the 2001 Arabian Horse Association Youth National Championships, and the East Coast Arabian Championships. Internationally, Wendy has judged the 2004 South African Regional Championship and the 2007 Canadian Arabian National Championships. "I enjoy judging horse shows of all levels, from 4-H up through International competition. It is an honor and a privilege to judge the Kentucky State 4-H Championship Show".

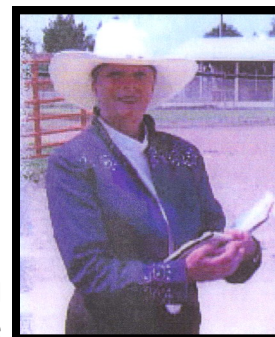
Pam Cornett*Ohio**English & Miniature Division*

Pam started teaching Equitation and Horsemanship at the age of 15. That led her to develop her skills, and create the 3-C Farm Horsemanship School. Approximately 150 students are enrolled annually at 3-C Farm, taking lessons mostly once each week. As of 2007, Pam has been teaching for 41 years, and judging horse shows for 26 years. Pam has judged State, Regional, District, County Fairs and Open Shows. In 2006, Pam judged the Ohio State Fair 4-H in Saddleseat and Gaited. Pam's background is riding Morgan horses in Saddleseat, Hunt and Western seats. She has shown horses in hand and under saddle both in Park and Pleasure. Bryan attended Ohio State University and was a member of the horse judging team that competed at Quarter Horse Congress, AQHA World Show and National Western. The following year, he became assistant coach to the team and has been judging 4-H and open shows in and around Ohio since graduating from college. Bryan is now attending graduate school at the University of Kentucky and serves as one of the coaches of the UK Horse Judging Team.

Jennifer Moshier

Jennifer is a third generation horseman from Ohio and has been showing horses since her first Lead Line class at age 2. Mrs. Moshier has had the opportunity to train and show many different breeds from AQHA, PtHA, ApHc, Arabians, Morgans, Saddlebreds, and Walking Horses. Jennifer won all three AHA Medals (Saddle Seat, Stock Seat, and Hunt Seat) in Region 16 at the age of 17 on her three Arabians and Half Arabians. She is a graduate of nationally known SUNY Morrisville with an AAS degree in Equine Husbandry. Jennifer holds 4 national breed cards: PtHA, POAC, ABRA and NWA. She is recognized as a senior judge on 6 state 4H/ Open show judges lists, and judges about 40-50 shows annually in the US and Canada.

Lisa VanVleet Lewis, arriving from Houston, Texas is a Licensed Master of Social Work, University of Houston with a Bachelor's (Psychology) from Berea College, Kentucky. Lisa is a United States Equestrian Drill Association (USEDA) certified coach, USEDA certified judge and writer, with articles published in Paso Fino Horse World and The Gaited Horse. Lisa has performed as an equestrian in breed demonstrations and drill exhibitions for crowds as large as 5000 at well-known events such as Equus and BreyerFest. She competes individually at breed shows and coaches others for competition in horsemanship, equitation and breed show classes. Passionate about horses and drill, Lisa has taken a leadership role in the discipline by coaching others in drill and has been busy establishing FINISIMO (pronounced FEE NEE SEE MOE, meaning "the finest" in Spanish). Lisa is the founding director of FINISIMO, a non-profit, 501c(3) charitable organization that teaches horsemanship, equitation and promotes competition in equestrian drill. Though the organization is in its youth, FINISIMO was able to garner a 2006 National Champion title in the USEDC Gaited division as well as many other State and Regional successes. Lisa is the Region 4 Director of the United States Equestrian Drill Association and maintains membership in USEF (United States Equestrian Federation), PFHA (Paso Fino Horse Association), SWPFHA (Southwestern Paso Fino Horse Association), and AYHC (American Youth Horse Council). In 2006, Lisa was honored by the USED A Director's Award.

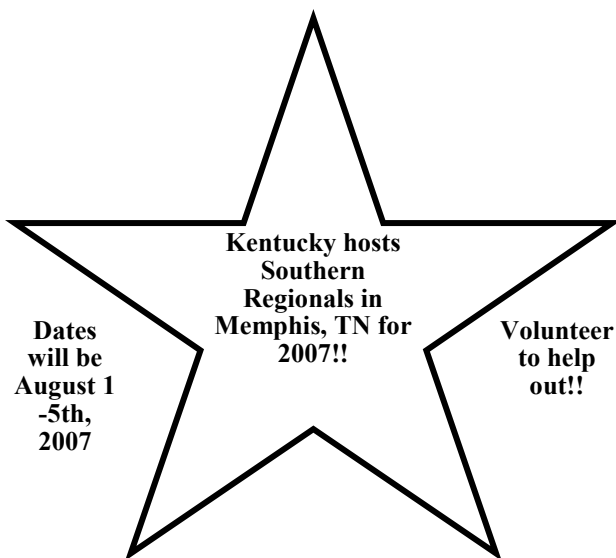

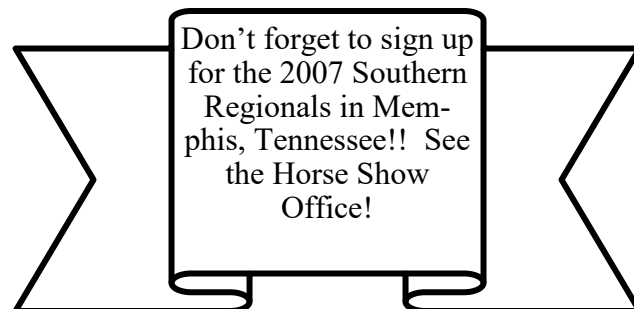

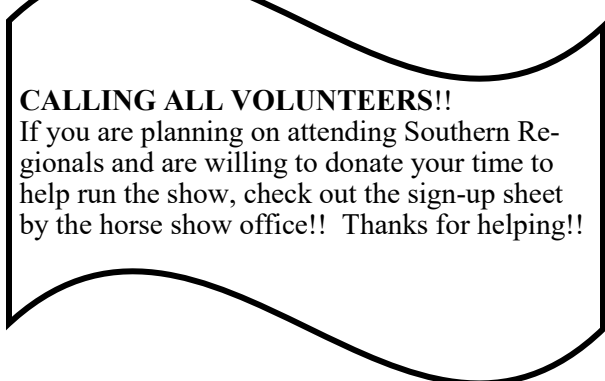
