Tips for Participants

- Wear old clothes and shoes that have not been worn on any other sheep premise in the last 7 days.
- 2. Stretch and exercise for a few weeks before coming to the school.
- 3. Bring your own shearers, if you have them.
- 4. Study the steps in shearing a sheep

- 5. Must not show any signs of illness or been exposed in the last 7 days.
- Must not have been outside the U.S. in the last 7 days.
