The University of Kentucky is committed to supporting the growth of our pre-veterinary advising program, in the hopes of supporting students and fostering excitement for the veterinary profession.

In early 2022, a large animal veterinarian shortage was reported in Kentucky as farmers struggle to find veterinary services in rural areas. Fostering the next generation of veterinary professionals has become a priority, not only to recruit students to this career path but to support a healthier work/life balance and financial stability for those currently in the field.

On February 15, 2025, the UK Martin-Gatton College of Agriculture, Food and Environment and the Kentucky Horse Council have again joined forces to offer a Pre-Veterinary Experience Day, a day-long opportunity for undergraduate students interested in a veterinary career. With major successes in 2024, this event will focus on sharing information critical for informed decision-making while exploring the diversity of career options available within veterinary medicine.

Located at The Thoroughbred Training Center, in Lexington Kentucky, 150 pre-registered undergraduate students interested in a veterinary career will attend the event. Students will start the day with academic seminars offered by pre-veterinary advisors, followed by a panel discussion composed of veterinary professionals who will discuss their experiences within the veterinary industry. Students will also engage in one focus option with a choice of subject and location: private small animal, private mixed animal, private equine, corporate large animal/livestock, government, and practical wildlife. These focus areas will give attendees the opportunity to experience a specific aspect of veterinary medicine and ask questions of a professional in their area of interest.

This event aims to develop a population of pre-veterinary students who are knowledgeable, dedicated, and passionate about the veterinary profession, taking us one step closer to addressing veterinary industry issues.

PRE-VETERINARY EXPERIENCE DAY



SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 15 | THOROUGHBRED TRAINING CENTER | LEXINGTON, KY

The Pre-Vet Experience Day provides undergraduate students interested in a veterinary career with information critical for informed decision making.

Hosted in Lexington, KY, this day-long event offers students insight into current veterinary medicine issues, highlighting the exciting diversity of career opportunities while addressing topics like student debt, mental health and work-life balance. A panel discussion with current veterinary professionals will debate functional ways of navigating these industry concerns.

Attendees will also have the ability to choose between informational sessions based on their level of knowledge and stage of preparation for veterinary school.

Those who are early in their investigation of the pre-veterinary pathway may choose sessions focused on assessing their veterinary schools and understanding basic application requirements. Those students who are further along in their pre-veterinary journey can opt into sessions providing insight into the Veterinary Medical College Application Service (VMCAS) and advanced strategies in presenting themselves as competitive veterinary school applicants.

In the afternoon, students will have the opportunity to engage with industry professionals as they explore an aspect of veterinary medicine through one of six potential focus options including:

- » Private Equine Focus – Park Equine Hospital
- » Private Small Animal Focus– Richmond Road Veterinary Clinic
- » Private Mixed Animal Focus – Commonwealth Veterinary Clinic
- » Corporate Large Animal/Livestock Focus – Bluegrass Stockyards
- » Government, Corporate and Academic Opportunities – UK Veterinary Diagnostic Lab
- » Practical Wildlife Focus – Wildlife veterinarians hosted by The Thoroughbred Training Center

The Pre-Veterinary Experience Day is hosted by the University of Kentucky with collaboration from the Kentucky Horse Council and supported by multiple industry partners. It is designed to encourage and foster interest in veterinary careers by providing up-to-date information on a variety of topics, including career opportunities, financial assistance, veterinary school applications and more.
