The University of Kentucky is committed to supporting the growth of our pre-veterinary advising program, in the hopes of supporting students and fostering excitement for the veterinary profession. In early 2022, a large animal veterinarian shortage was reported in Kentucky as farmers struggle to find veterinary services in rural areas. Fostering the next generation of veterinary professionals has become a priority, not only to recruit students to this career path, but to support a healthier work/life balance and financial stability for those currently in the field.

On February 17, 2024, the UK Martin-Gatton College of Agriculture, Food and Environment and the Kentucky Horse Council are joining forces to offer a *Pre-Veterinary Experience Day*, a day-long opportunity for undergraduate students interested in a veterinary career. This event will focus on sharing information critical for informed decision making while exploring the diversity of career options available within veterinary medicine. Located at the Kentucky Horse Park, 100 pre-registered undergraduate students with interest in a veterinary career will attend the event. Students will start the day with academic seminars offered by pre-veterinary advisors, followed by a panel discussion composed of veterinary professionals who will discuss their experiences within the veterinary industry. Students will also attend various tours in Central Kentucky with a choice of subject and location: companion and small animal; livestock, equine; or government and academia. These tours will give attendees the opportunity to view a veterinary facility and ask questions of a professional in their area of interest.

This event aims to develop a population of pre-veterinary students who are knowledgeable, dedicated, and passionate about the veterinary profession, taking us one step closer to addressing current veterinary industry issues.
