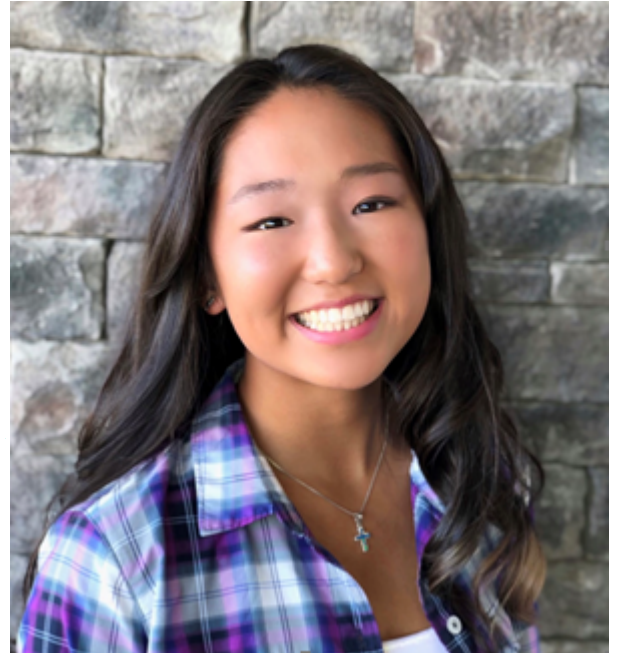

Brooke is from Pulaski County and has a passion for horses. She is active in her 4-H Horse Club and is excited to be able to represent Kentucky at the national level.

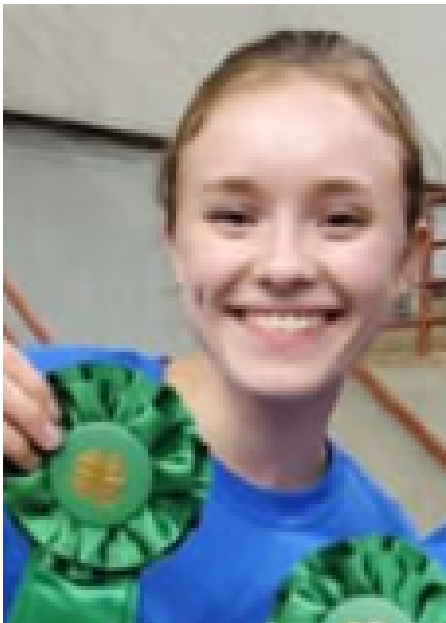

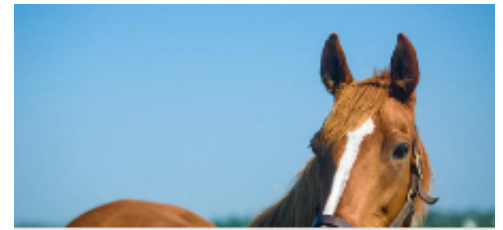

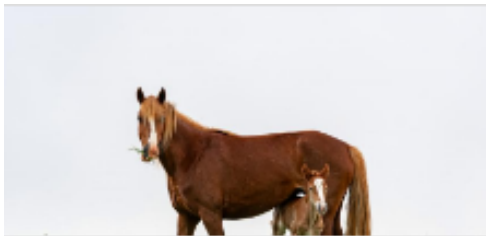

CLASS SCHEDULE

1. **Stick Horse Class** (. Some stick horses available for use.) Ribbons to all.
2. **Model Class** (May wear either a halter or bridle. Ribbons only.)
3. **Lead line Class** (Riders must be 8 & under.)
4. **Fun Class** (Class posted on our Facebook page 2 weeks prior to show. Ribbons only.)
5. **Pleasure Pony 14.2 and Under** (Walk & Favorite Gait*.)
6. **Adult Go-As-You-Please** (Walk & Go-As-You-Please*. Ribbons only.)
7. **Ladies Trail Pleasure** (Walk & Favorite Gait*.)
8. **4-H Class** (Open to ANY 4-H member and junior exhibitor. Walk & Favorite Gait*.)
9. **Seniors Pleasure Horse or Pony** (For riders 50 & over. Walk & Favorite Gait*.)
10. **Western Pleasure Horse or Pony** (Walk & Jog.) Sponsor:
11. **5 Year Old and Under Pleasure** (Age is that of the HORSE. Walk & Favorite Gait*.)
12. **Pleasure Horse or Pony** (Rider 18 & under. Walk & Favorite Gait*.) Sponsor:
13. **Youth 18 & Under Go-As-You-Please** (Walk & Go-As-You-Please*. Ribbons only.)

14. **Style Racking or Pacing Horse or Pony** (Walk, Slow Gait, & Rack or Pace.)
15. **Western Pleasure Horse or Pony** (Western tack required. Walk, Jog, & Lope.)
16. **Open Equitation** (Class judged only on the rider. Ribbons only.)
17. **Open Go-As-You-Please** (Walk & Go-As-You-Please*. Ribbons only.)
18. **English Pleasure Horse or Pony** (Walk, Trot, & Canter.)
19. **Trail Pleasure Horse or Pony** (Riders 18 & under. Walk & Favorite Gait*.)
20. **Generation Gap Open Pleasure** (10 years age difference of riders. Walk & Favorite Gait*.)
21. **Western Country Pleasure** (Western tack required. Walk & Favorite Gait*.)
22. **Pleasure Walking Horse or Pony** (Walk & Running Walk)
23. **Speed Racking/Pacing Horse or Pony** (Walk, Slow Gait, & Rack/Pace. Judged on Speed.)
24. **English Trail Pleasure** (English tack required. Walk & Favorite Gait*.)
25. **Western Trail Pleasure** (Walk & Favorite Gait*.)
26. **The Joe Gill Memorial Open Pleasure Championship** (Entry Fee \$10. See back for more info.)

Pioneer Saddle Club Horse Shows

ALL PLEASURE GAITS/GO-AS-YOU-PLEASE/FAVORITE GAIT CLASSES CANNOT CANTER OR LOPE
ALL HORSES ON PREMISES MUST HAVE A COGGINS TEST AND HEALTH CERTIFICATE

- ~Regular (non-championship) classes: 70% pay back. Pays 3 places: 30%, 25%, & 15%, plus ribbons for places 1st-5th.
- ~Joe Gill Memorial Pleasure Championship class: 80% pay back. Pays 4 places: 30%, 25%, 15%, & 10%.
- ~1st place of each class (other than #1,2,3,4,6,13,16,17 & 26) get a CHOICE between a trophy & ribbon OR the 30% of the combined entry fees.
- ~RIBBON ONLY classes have NO monetary payback. RIBBON ONLY classes DO award points for the High Point Award Program.
- ~Trophies or money will NOT be awarded in classes with three entries or less. Classes with three entries or less will become RIBBON ONLY classes.
- ~Horses may be excused for not having proper class tack or unruiness. Refunds will NOT be issued in this case.
- ~All HORSES MUST be kept UNDER CONTROL at ALL TIMES
- ~Pads 1/2" or less permitted in pleasure classes. NO WEDGES permitted
- ~Only non-weighted bell boots allowed in classes. NO other artificial equipment allowed.
- ~Closed toed shoes are required.
- ~Helmets are recommended but not required.

Class #4 in each of our shows will be listed as "Fun Class".

The specific class for a particular show's "Fun Class" will be ANNOUNCED on the Pioneer Saddle Club Facebook page 2 WEEKS BEFORE each show.

Show Series High Point Award Divisions:

1 Adult Award

1 Youth Award (18 & under)

Age for junior exhibitors is their age on Jan. 1st of the current year.

Point will be tallied throughout the season and the award will be given to the person in each division with the most points at the end of the Show Series.

Points will be calculated throughout the show season at all of the Pioneer Saddle Club Shows.
