

Horse Shoe Holiday Craft











Supplies:

- Horse Shoes
- Leather Lace
- Mod Podge
- Adhesive that works on metal
- Ribbon
- Seasonal garland/decorations




Instructions

- 1. Clean shoes if using repurposed shoes (soak in white vinegar for a few minutes & scrub)
- 2. Tie a knot with leather lace through nail hole and loop and tie on other side to create a hanger; dip each knot in mod podge to secure. Once dried use metal adhesive (or mod podge) to glue leather lace to back of shoe to ensure an even hang.
- 3. Arrange decorative pieces as you wish along the shoe (one side as shown or get creative and make your own design!) Glue down to shoe.
- 4. Attach bow and other decorative items as you wish. You can add a horse's name tag, barn name, etc to personalize!
- 5. Voila! You can hang in your tree, around the barn, or gift to a friend!
