PUMPKIN PIE HORSE STYLE

Recipe courtesey of: Horse illustrated

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 small pumpkin
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon
- · 1 teaspoon nutmeg (optional)
- 1/4 cup molasses (other options include honey or applesauce)
- 1/2 cup brown sugar

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.
- 2. Mix the pumpkin flesh with the other ingredients in a large bowl.
- 3. Spoon out evenly-sized balls on a cookie sheet. If mixture is too runny, add more molasses for binding.
- 4. Bake 12-15 minutes.
