A Treat For My Sweet Recipe



Ingredients:

- 3 Cups Flour
- 1 Cup Powdered Sugar
- Splash of Water (or apple juice!)
- 1.5 Tsp. Cinnamon
- 2 Cups Molasses
- Toppings (optional): shredded/grated carrot, apple slivers, crushed peppermint, sprinkles, etc

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 325 degrees F
- 2. Line cookie sheet with tin foil
- 3. Mix flour and cinnamon together. Then add molasses and mix until dough consistency
- 4. Roll out dough on a clean, floured surface
- 5. Cut the dough into rectangles-a pizza cutter works great! Then press edges with a fork
- 6. Bake 15 minutes
- 7. While baking, make icing by combining the powdered sugar with a splash of water (or apple juice!) until you get desired consistency.
- 8. Drizzle/dip/frost after cookies are fully cooled. While icing is still wet, you can add toppings! Shredded carrot, thinly sliced apples, sprinkles, crushed up peppermints, or anything else your BFF loves!
