Pinto

Type: Color Breed: Stock type, Pleasure type, Miniature type, Saddle type and Hunter type

Origin: 19 recognized outcross breeds

Uses: Showing, ranch work, jumping, trail riding, pleasure, etc.

Size: Vary: Mini, pony and horse

Color patterns: Must have spotted coat, or be registered as breeding stock.

<u>Description:</u> There are many types of Pinto Horses. The Hunter type horse is predominantly Thoroughbred and approved European Warmblood that is suitable for a variety of events such as Hunt Seat and Western. The Stock type horse is a western horse that is predominantly Paint and Quarter horse and is suitable for Western, Hunt Seat and other events. The Pleasure type horse is predominantly Andalusian, Morgan and Arabian breeding and can be used in Western, Hunt and Saddle Seat, Driving, and other events. The Saddle type horse displays high head carriage and animated, high-knee action. They are predominantly from Saddlebred, Andalusian, Tennessee Walking Horse, or Hackney breeding. Miniature Horses can also be Pinto. They must meet all registration requirements for Pintos.
