Topics

- Ask permission if riding or parking on private land
- Use marked trails on public land. Obey closure signs



- Forest Service, County and State parks, National Parks, Bureau of Land Management, Army Corps of Engineers, Fish & Wildlife
- Speed: At rate for most inexperienced horse/rider
 - Break into two groups if necessary

Manure



- Where it should be (trail, trailhead)
- NOTE: No danger to humans

 no tree tying unless cross tied, in safe place, off trail, not by reins/bit

Water Crossings



Wait for everyone; use as training moment

Leave No Trace



 Taking care of the environment & others who follow behind
